# The Lodge History

**1880**

The Lodge was built as a home for the cemetery caretaker

**2002**

Plans for the Lodge building to become a visitor centre were created



**2020**

The Lodge closed to due COVID but we continued to memorialize virtually!



**Dec 21 1988**

The Garden of Remembrance was started

**Oct 2003**

The Dryfesdale Lodge and Visitor Centre was opened with the goal to further remembrance. Areas such as the memorial room were added to aid this goal.

# Pan Am Flight 103

- Pan Am Flight 103 was flying from London Heathrow to New York JFK when it was bombed over Lockerbie, Scotland
- All 259 people aboard the flight died, as well as 11 people on the ground
- The goal of the Lodge and Garden of Remembrance is to honor the lives lost that day



—  
The attack on flight 103 represents a shift in the international community as corporation between multiple nations was required.

**Over 10,000 people were interviewed from 190 countries.**

The bombing sparked monumental changes in aviation security, international cooperation and family support.

# Garden of Remembrance

- The Garden of Remembrance started right after the bombing in December of 1988 when three simple stones were placed
  - As time went on individual families started to have plaques in the Garden as well
  - Exactly one year after the attack, December 21st 1989, a large granite memorial was dedicated to all 270 victims
  - To this day people come from all over the world to honor the lives lost
